Psalm 51

It is God who possesses the incredible power not
only to create the universe as we know it, but also
to put it into motion on command on a daily basis.
The universe, our planet, and the sun which rises
and sets on His command give testimony to the
Awesome, mighty, power of God!
As creator of all, He makes the rules by which all
are governed. This makes Him the best judge of
whether things are operating according to the design
He used to make them. This includes both the
material things around us and all living beings.

God proclaims that He wants His people, those who have made a covenant (with sacrifice) to be His people, to offers sacrifices, not for His benefit, but for ours! Our sacrifices are simply evidence of our thankfulness to God for His total provision for us. But, be well advised. It is a grave mistake to take any vow to God lightly. God will not only hold you accountable for your vows, He will also deal with you severely if you do not follow through with it.

But the good news is, "God promises to rescue us any and every time we call upon Him." And the wicked will not get away with their willful disobedience forever! It is only those who seek God and are willing to sacrifice something who will receive His salvation.

Philippians 3:1-12

Many of us have the tendency to think that our			
pedigree gives us some advantage over others			
with respect to spiritual matters and a relationship			
to God. Well, the Apostle Paul had among the			
finest credentials and family history of anyone.			
But he stated clearly that none of this was of any			
significance at all relative to the fulfillment of the			
purposes of the cause of Christ.			

We often get caught up in our "religiosity" as thoughit were the most important thing in life. We are proudto be rated high on the scale of spirituality as mea-sured by the "do"s and "don't"s of our church. ButGod sees all of our righteousness as "filthy rags."We need a thorough "washing" by God's spirit.

Now the bottom line of all this is: "The single mostsignificant issue in all of life is knowing Christ fully.I can only be found righteous through Christ'srighteousness, and am only seen as perfectlyclean based on my faith in God.

So, how about it?Why not try God's way insteadof your own notion?Talk to God now!> Confess that you are nothing and unclean> Ask Christ to be your spiritual mate and guide> Commit everything you have and are to Him



1 Finally, my brethren, rejoice in the Lord. To write the same things again is no trouble to me, and it is a safeguard for you. 2 Beware of the dogs, beware of the evil workers, beware of the false circumcision;

3 for we are the true circumcision, who worship in the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh,

4 although I myself might have confidence even in the flesh. When you are asked to pray for someone or some thing, be sure that the request is very specific. Only commit to a certain time frame or "as God brings them to mind." Be realistic in your commitments. If you in good faith cannot pray with a sense of conviction that God will answer in a positive way, you should likely not commit to pray for that specific request. WE ARE NOT ALL CONVINCED OF THE SAME RESULTS! You cannot be a prayer warrior if you do not believe that victory will be yours. Choose your prayer battles wisely. Then pray to the "end!"
