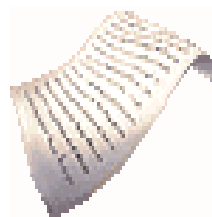

Petition: (asking God to do something in me)

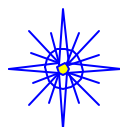

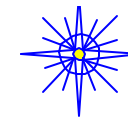
22 Even if you ground up a foolish person like grain in a bowl, you couldn't remove the foolishness. (NCV)

22 Though you pound a fool in a mortar with a pestle along with crushed grain, Yet his folly will not depart from him. (NASB)

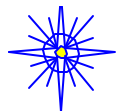
